Course Description: This course provides an essential foundation in psychology tailored for physiotherapy students. It explores key psychological concepts and theories that influence human behavior, mental processes, and emotional responses. Topics covered include psychological development, the impact of mental health on physical rehabilitation, cognitive and behavioral factors in pain perception, patient motivation, and the therapeutic relationship. Students will also examine how psychological principles can enhance patient care and outcomes, emphasizing communication strategies, empathy, and patient-centered practices. Through a combination of lectures, discussions, and practical applications, this course aims to equip future physiotherapists with the knowledge and skills necessary to understand and address the psychological aspects of patient care, fostering a holistic approach to rehabilitation.

Grading: Grades will consist of class participation, a midterm exam, discussion board posts, and a final exam.

Class Participation (20% of grade)

Students are expected to come to class prepared and ready to participate.

Poor participation, unexcused absences, and consistent tardiness will lead to lost points for participation.

Discussion Board Posts (20% of grade)

Students will periodically be asked to post or reflect on the course content via Moodle Discussion Board. More detailed instructions will be provided for each required post.

Midterm Examination (25% of grade)

The midterm examination will consist of multiple choice, short answer, and brief essays relevant to the course material (inclusive of lectures, class discussions, and assigned readings). The purpose of the exam is for students to synthesize course material related to psychopathology in an efficient and effective manner. The final Exam will be administered in class on November 5, 2024.

Final Examination (35% of grade)

The final examination will consist of multiple choice, short answer, and brief essays relevant to the course material (inclusive of lectures, class discussions, and assigned readings). The purpose of the exam is for students to synthesize course material related to psychopathology in an efficient and effective manner. The final Exam will be administered in class on November 19, 2024.
